Part 1: The Overall Situation

Since the end of 2019-nCoV (Corona Virus) and now known as Covid19 become an emerging issue globally and now known as Covid19, the Government of Indonesia does anticipation in order to stop spreading and transmitting the virus in Indonesia. Government of Indonesia led by Ministry of Health does several actions such: do preparation of 132 hospitals in Indonesia to be ready if any cases of the virus, circulated information to the public, installed thermal scanner at the international arrival gate, lead the observation of Indonesian who pulled back from Wuhan at Natuna Island for 15 days and continue with the Indonesian worker work for World Dream Cruise Ship. The Covid19 Taskforce team led by BNPB (National Disaster Management Office) set the athlete compound to be used for an emergency hospital that can accommodate 3000 patients. The government of Indonesia also encourage Social Distancing in order to avoid the spread of Covid19 and made flexible working hours for state employe. Jakarta as the epicentrum of Covid19 cases, extended the emergency stage until 19 March 2020, therefore all public facility are close, school are close, government office staff allow work from home. - Cases where ChildFund operated 1,325 cases at 7 provinces from a total of 32 provinces affected. The total province in Indonesia is 34 provinces.
- Jakarta Province (Capital City) where three ChildFund's Partner presence reported there are 808 cases.
- There is no lockdown decision made by the government. The social distance and encouraging for no mobilization for people from city to the hometown in order to avoid virus transmission. There is no restriction area but the public transportation lesser at this moment.
- The government of Indonesia did not declare a state of emergency but the central government does the effort fighting the Covid19 using national resources. The status of declared by Government of Indonesia until 29 May 2020. Only Jakarta as province declared as a provincial emergency extended until 19 April 2020.
- There is no request for outside assistance.
- Most provincial decided to close school which until now until mid of April and further decision upon the situation.
- State employee allow working from home which depend on their type of work
- For Jakarta as the capital city, the government requested private sector and business company to let the staff work from home and may let the essential staff work from the office
- All meeting especially at Jakarta organized by the government, NGO, UN and other private sectors using an internet platform
- The government imported medicine and body protector related to Covid19 from China and South Korea
- The government continue to build hospital at Galang and Natuna island.
- Ministry of Social Affairs disburses earlier for case transfer for poor families (Program Keluarga Harapan).
- Local company are making Personal Body protection which using for the hospital. Central government are continue distributing the medical equipment to all province.

Part 3: ChildFund's Response

Several action has been conducted by ChildFund Indonesia:

1. Start from 23 March 2020 staff work from home and extended the work from home until 17 April 2020 apply for Jakarta Office, Kupang Office including EU-CSO staff, and staff based at partners.
2. Continue to update the staff on any emerging issue by email and Whapsapp group
3. Conducted bi-weekly staff meeting on Monday and Thursday
4. Starting identify what ChildFund's partners need in order responding the community need. Reviewing proposal submitted by partner to response the Covid19. The total 11 proposal from 11 partners are approved and ready to execute the intervention of Covid19 in respective areas and the other 4 proposal from partners in developing process.
5. ChildFund Indonesia also developing proposal which potentially submit to International Office and TFCF
6. Distribute IEC materials on COVID 19 that have been send out to all LPs (based on GoI materials and translated materials developed by ChildFund International Office)
7. LPs continue provided prevention tools such as : Mask, hand sanitizer to support local government if needed based on location and focused on community where they worked

8. Understanding the local government direction and follow the direction and not to denial.
9. Adding Covid19 as a topic on Parenting session at NTT areas where partners still doing the session by limiting number of participants
10. In area that already affected: we asked field facilitators to monitor the parents and children that involved in the Parenting classes, child forum - to ensure that they have been protected and follow government direction on social distancing, school from home
11. Reintroduced to the parents to provide local nutritious food for the children, everyday: such as Local Food
12. Activate the role and function of CBCPM (Community Base Child Protection Mechanism) to monitor Covid19 cases in community, to report and advise where to refer base on government regulation.
13. Advocacy; as a member of National End Violence against Children alliance - we contribute in the development of CP Protocols that initiated by KPPPA. Give inputs and comments.
14. Begin to collect voices from children and youth related to Covid19 and also taking short of children practicing hand washing video for communication purposes.
