Part 1: The Overall Situation

As of 27 May, the Government of Indonesia has announced 23,851 confirmed cases of COVID-19 across all provinces, with 1,473 deaths and 6,057 people have recovered from the illness.

Ministry of health release circular letter in supporting the continuation of businesses in the services and trade business sectors (public areas) during the Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic. The circular letter to regulate the prevention of COVID-19 transmission for workplace managers, business actors, workers, customers/consumers and society involved in the service and trade sectors (public areas) through adaptation of changes in life patterns in the COVID-19 situation (New Normal). The implementation of this protocol is expected to minimize the risk and the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic to businesses in the services and trade sectors (public areas) where there is a potential for COVID-19 transmission due to the gathering of a number/many people in one location. The Circular Letter is intended to increase the support and cooperation across sectors, Regional Governments, the business community, and all relevant stakeholders in an effort to prevent COVID-19 transmission in the workplaces of services and trade sectors (public areas). The circular letter also follow by information where the government of Indonesia plan to do relaxation of restriction in some place where the good progress of covid19 prevention.

On 27 May 2020, The President of Indonesia visited some places which included Mass Rapid Transportation in regarding to check the public place facility preparation into new normal situation after many people resume to do their business after led Mubarak.

- Cases where ChildFund operated 12,547 cases at 8 provinces from a total of 34 provinces affected.
- Jakarta Province (Capital City) where three ChildFund’s Partner presence reported there are 6,895 cases.
- There is no request for outside assistance but the Covid19 Task Force dedicate bank account number for donation.
- State own TV company (TVRI), the launch of online learning every day to help children study at home from elementary to high school from Monday to Friday as all schools decided to close until the end of April and further decision upon the situation. Home learning does not target the accomplishment of Curricula, but stressing on literacy and numeracy aspect (*refer to Guidelines Home Learning by Ministry of Education*).
- All meeting especially at Jakarta organized by the government, NGO, UN and other private sectors using an internet platform
- This week the 2 round of Bantuan Social (Package of Staple food) in greater Jakarta to the family affected by Covid19 begin by Ministry of Social Affairs.

- What issues are children in these areas facing: during this report period, the school close due to led Ramadhan holiday, therefore there is no issue reported on children on education. School closure, no national examination, and how to do home learning using an internet base. The challenge mainly faces by states school especially in a rural area where the children have no internet access therefore the children cannot do online learning with the teachers. As of 13 April 2020, the State TV company start the learning program for elementary to high school. Under Ministry of Education, there were reported that private school has no access to government fund is about to close (bankrupt because the school can pay the salary of teachers who rely on tuition fee from the student whose parents now lost their job and can not pay the tuition fee.

Part 3: ChildFund's Response

3.a. Overall

Responding to the current situation where Covid19 cases increases and government regulated to close the office who can manage their work from home, therefore ChildFund Indonesia extended working from home until 31 May 2020. The working from the home period will review the latest situation of covid19 and government regulations. In order to expedite the critical information, ChildFund Indonesia Office circulates the information through the Whatsapp group and held bi-weekly meetings on Monday and Thursday.

ChildFund Indonesia through Partners continues responding to the emergency situation. When the funding source using sponsorship funds, the emergency respond manages and lead by each ChildFund's Partners. If ChildFund Indonesia awarded for new funding proposed under Asia Proposal, therefore ChildFund Indonesia will lead the emergency response.

Currently, ChildFund's partners working on their proposal for the 2nd stage of response which will using subsidy funds identified not possible to do the activities during Covid19 until end of FY 20. Various intervention identified by partners which mostly intervention to support family affected by Covid19.

ChildFund Indonesia proposal submitted to ChildFund Korea approved by ChildFund Korea and the team will conduct inception workshop with implementing partners and team.

3.b. Program Response

Covid19 response in the field by 15 ChildFund's partners has reach 304,150 Household (1,188,636 people in 168 villages of 29 districts in 8 provinces:

- a. 27,627 KIE (Information Education and Communication of leaflets, posters, banners and billboards) materials distributed to family, community and health institution at village, sub district and district level
- b. Distributed 14 container boxes
- c. Distributed 20 units Loud Speaker
- d. Installed 355 handwashing station
- e. Distributed 124 buckets
- f. Distributed 2,736 soap
- g. Distributed 14 pack detergent
- h. Distributed 82 pack tissue
- i. Sprayed of disinfectant to 188 locations
- j. Distributed 1,157 bottles of disinfectant liquid
- k. Distributed 163 bottles of hand sanitizer

- l. Distributed 19,236 face mask
- m. 86 times training how to make disinfectant
- n. Distributed 132 Personal Protection Equipment for the medical team
- o. Distributed 114 aprons full disposable
- p. Distributed gloves 1,608 set
- q. Distributed 52 boots
- r. Radio talk show 3 times
- s. Webinar meeting with the youth group, CSO and government conducted with themes:
 - View and Youth Roles during Covid19
 - The village policy on Covid19
 - Community-Based Child Protection during covid19
 - Writing skill for youth
- t. Accessing online study via cube notes by 221 children
- u. Support foodbank at 3 villages and 22 Kitchen Garden
- v. Support

All the above accomplishments are using the subsidy funds where each partner's allocated emergency funds, social safety nets, and also some saving funds from implemented activities. Currently, ChildFund Indonesia reviewing proposals of Partners who propose to change their annual plan that not possible to implement due to Covid19. The activity changes for April-June 2020 plan.

ChildFund Indonesia will remain to collaborate with existing partners as the Covid19 also affected community in all areas of ChildFund's partners.

ChildFund Indonesia encourages all Partners to a strong push to help CBCPM (Community Base Child Protection Mechanism) to monitor Covid19 cases in the community, to report and advise where to refer base on government regulation. Bring into a discussion of activities were still possible to conduct such parenting session by adding a topic of Covid19 into the discussion at NTT Province.

3.b.1. Stop COVID-19 from infecting children and families

ChildFund's Global Response Plan

To help children and families protect themselves from COVID-19, we are installing community, handwashing stands; educating communities about symptoms, hygiene measures and where to get tested or treatment; and distributing soap, hand sanitizer, gloves and masks to families and frontline, health workers. For children who are being treated for COVID-19 or are subject to quarantine measures, we are creating child-friendly spaces with age-appropriate toys and reading matter.

3.b.2. Ensure that children get food they need

ChildFund's Global Response Plan

To ensure that the most vulnerable families can keep food on the table, pay rent and cover other basic needs, we are providing cash for those families most needing this support, such as those who have lost their income because of COVID-19, child or elder-headed households, and/or households affected by disability or chronic illness. Where possible, we are distributing food and basic household items directly, carefully abiding by COVID-19 protection measures

3.b.2. 1. Cash Transfers and vouchers

- ChildFund will implement cash base transfer funded by CF Korea for 2 partners working area, while another partners who are thinking to do cash base transfer because can not implement their program from April to June 2020, still on discussion among the partners staff and management.

- When Partners identified family under observation of Covid19, therefore food support provided to family as they quarantine and not possible to do work and earn money. This happened to enroll family who under observation of Covid19 at South Sumatera.

3.b.3. Keep children safe from Violence: physically and emotionally

ChildFund’s Global Response Plan

We are supporting community-based child protection systems that identify, respond to and refer cases of abuse, neglect, violence or exploitation. We are also providing virtual, online psychological first aid and counseling, and supporting temporary shelters for children who live on the street, providing hygiene supplies, food and other basics. We are also arranging safe and appropriate care for children who are separated from their caregivers due to treatment or prevention measures.

ChildFund Indonesia conduct survey to hear child voice. The survey result been analyzed and report available upon request as the report still in Indonesia Language.

3.b.4. Help children continue to do their job: Learning

ChildFund’s Global Response Plan

While schools remain closed, we are supporting children’s learning through activities and tutoring sessions online or by radio. For students without reliable internet access, we are distributing home learning kits with materials and guides for their use.

3.b.5. Other responses

ChildFund provided guidelines for parents on how to manage the situation during covid19 hence the children will do a happy home learning session.
