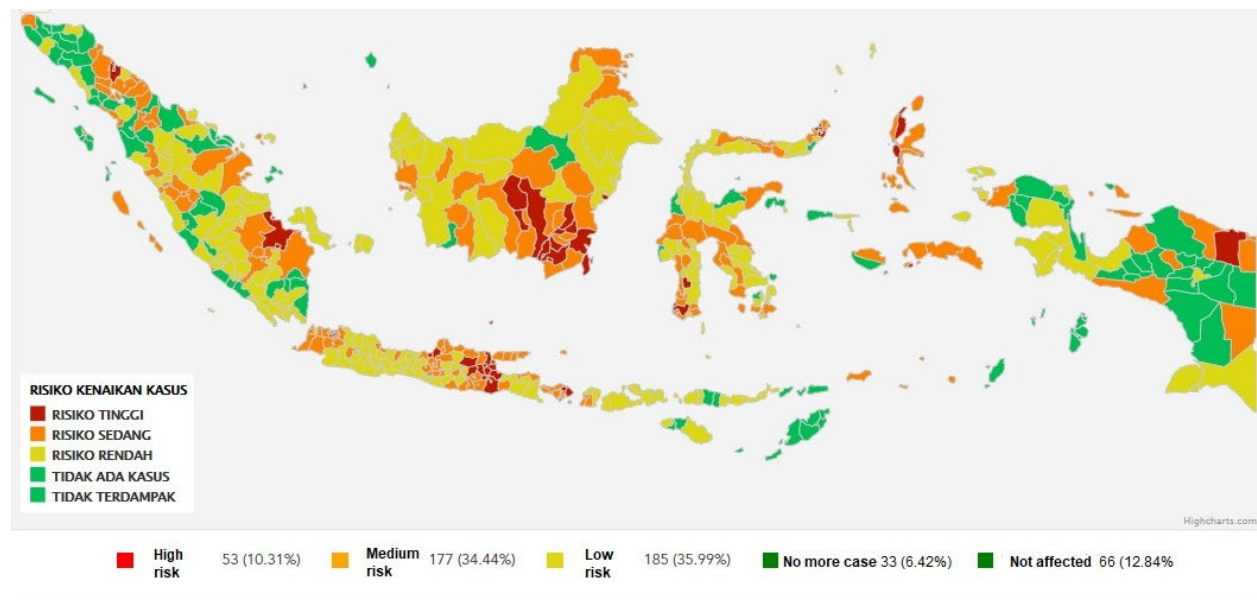

Part 1: The Overall Situation

As of 07 July 2020, the Government of Indonesia has announced 66,226 confirmed cases of COVID-19 across all provinces, with 3,309 deaths and 30,785 people have recovered from the illness. Over 946,054 specimens has been tested by using the Real Time Polymerase Chain Reaction Assay (RT-PCR) and the Molecular Rapid Test for Tuberculosis (TCM TB) methods, in 270 laboratories across the country. Increasing number of people being tested resulted increasing cases report.

In the context of Adaptation to the New Behavior for productive and safe communities against COVID-19 disease, the Task Force for the Acceleration of the COVID-19 response regularly updates the risk mapping, based on criteria and parameters set by the WHO. The following map from the Task Force shows the level of risk using the latest data (of 28 June 2020):



Red : High risk
Orange : Medium risk
Yellow : Low risk
Green : No cases
Light green : No affected

The Ministry of Health, in collaboration with the Public Health Laboratory Association (APHL), conducted two rounds of training on PCR testing for COVID-19, which were attended by around 200 students

majoring in laboratories. The WHO presented global and national updates on COVID-19, and updated laboratory testing guidelines for COVID-19. In addition, training is underway for PCR testing; six trainings for laboratory students and one for the Indonesian Food and Drug Administration (BPOM) staff.

A socialization webinar on Waste Management during COVID-19, including on the current policy on solid and liquid waste management, water, sanitation and hygiene as well as on the use of incinerators and autoclaves was held at the end of June, and was attended by 512 participants from the Provincial and District Health Offices; it was also viewed by another 4,378 people through YouTube streaming. This webinar is the first of its series on this topic and carried out across the 34 provinces.

UNFPA has provided support to the National Population and Family Planning Agency in the preparation of Guidelines and Technical Guidelines for Services and Availability of Contraception in Crisis Situations, as well as to the Ministry of Health to prepare the Minimum Initial Service Package Guidelines in Elderly Reproductive Health Services. Mental health and psychosocial support (MHPSS) messages have been disseminated by UNICEF to 670,469 individuals (347,782 children; 322,687 adults /young people/ caregivers) through its and partners' platforms.

Logistics capacity assessments are ongoing in East Java, South Sulawesi, West Java, Central Java, South Kalimantan, South Sumatra, Papua, Banten, West Nusa Tenggara and Bali, involving logistics stakeholders including the private sector. The reports are expected to be available in the next three weeks. The Hand Washing with Soap (HWWS) Guidance has been issued by the Ministry of Health with the support of UNICEF. The guidance provides five options for the creation of simple HWWS facilities, with estimated costs ranging from a very minimum to five million Indonesian rupiah.

Parenting modules are being rolled out in institutions and with parents, with a focus on coping with COVID-19 and the prevention of violence against children. To date, the modules have benefited 89,400 children (44,400 girls; 45,000 boys) in 298 out of 514 districts. A series of trainings on GBV risk mitigation in the context of COVID-19 took place, with the participation of 159 UNICEF staff and consultants (102 females; 57 males), as well as 346 staff and volunteers from the Government and NGO/CSO partners. Subsequent to the training for partners working on Integrative Social Welfare Services for Children and Families in Java, access to safe reporting of sexual abuse and exploitation has been extended to more than 2.7 million persons (including more than 1 million children) in the provinces of East and Central Java.

Protection and Management of Gender Based Violence (GBV) and Women's Empowerment, some activities carried out by the sub-cluster members and partners include:

- Support to the implementation of GBV prevention and management protocols during the COVID-19 crisis in Jakarta, NTT, West Kalimantan, Depok, Bekasi, North Lombok and Central Sulawesi (Wahana Visi Indonesia, LPSDM, UNFPA)
- Strengthen or building of community-based service referral mechanisms within existing government mechanisms in NTB and Central Sulawesi. (LPSDM, Kapal Perempuan, Libu Perempuan, KPKPST, Sikola Mobine)
- Provision of direct assistance to affected women in Jakarta, West Java, Banten, East Java, Central Java, South Sulawesi, NTB, NTT, West Sumatra, Yogyakarta, North Sulawesi and Central Sulawesi (Kapal Perempuan, Kerti Praja Foundation, UNFPA)

- Strengthening of the capacity of villages in the COVID-19 Task Force on the role of women in the prevention and management of GBV in Papua and Jakarta (UNDP).

The dissemination of communication messages, materials and tools for key nutrition and social behavior changes has been undertaken through a wide range of platforms and has reached 5,103,000 people. The Ministry of Health, in partnership with UNICEF, has organized a series of webinars on nutrition topics such as nutrition in emergencies, adolescent nutrition, infant and young child feeding and maternal nutrition, attracting the participation of more than 20,000 national and subnational stakeholders.

To assess the effectiveness of off-line learning, the second phase of a national assessment was conducted through the Ministry of Education and Culture TV broadcasts, by using UNICEF’s RapidPro platform. A survey on the wider effectiveness of learning from home was also conducted, targeting parents and students across Indonesia, with a specific focus in remote rural areas of Papua. The results will inform the on-going monitoring of off-line learning which will be conducted on a weekly basis and reported through national systems.

To get a comprehensive analysis of the socio-economic impact of community protection programmes, National Cluster on Early Recovery members are conducting a series of surveys, including household surveys with SMERU and BPS (using Susenas Database), a survey activity framework for MSME, a gender survey with LPEM UI, and innovative financing analysis.

- What issues are children in these areas facing: during this reporting period, most school children ending their school calendar and will start the new school calendar 13 July 2020. The government do measuring if the school can open for study which it depend on the situation and anticipating by developing guideline if student need to continue home learning.
- As of 13 April 2020, the State TV company start the learning program for elementary to high school. Under Ministry of Education, there were reported that private school has no access to government fund is about to close (bankrupt because the school can pay the salary of teachers who rely on tuition fee from the student whose parents now lost their job and can not pay the tuition fee.

Part 3: ChildFund's Response

3.a. Overall

Responding to the current situation where Covid19 cases increases and Jakarta the Capital City regulated to extend its transitional covid19 mobility restriction by 14 days (start from 1 July 2020), where at same time ChildFund Indonesia Office introducing the 10-4 approach when we return to the office. ChildFund identifying the staff into 2 groups, if staff find their job can be done from home, should be done from home.

Continuing working on Cash Assistance Program preparation for 5 ChildFund's partners for the 2nd stage of response which will be using subsidy funds and new additional subsidy funds from IO in responding to Covid19. The funds been just approved by International Office while writing this sitrep. There are 1,760 households targeted from 5 ChildFund's partners.

Continuing the program supported by ChildFund Korea responding to covid19. ChildFund with partners been distributed mask and hand washing stations to 2 targeted villages. The registration of Cash Assistance Program beneficiaries been done and will do distribution the week of this sitrep period and continue early next week by PT Pos Indonesia (Financial Service Provider).

3.b. Program Response

The partners currently have been doing work of their program integrating with Covid19 in the more regular activities. The parenting program added covid19 as one of the topics to discuss on radio broadcasting or have a small family group supporting by facilitators.

Covid19 response in the field by 15 ChildFund's partners has reached 304,150 Household (1,188,636 people in 168 villages of 29 districts in 8 provinces:

- a. 27,627 KIE (Information Education and Communication of leaflets, posters, banners, and billboards) materials distributed to family, community and health institution at the village, sub-district and district level
- b. Distributed 14 container boxes
- c. Distributed 20 units, Loud Speaker
- d. Installed 355 handwashing station
- e. Distributed 124 buckets
- f. Distributed 2,736 soap
- g. Distributed 14 pack detergent
- h. Distributed 82 pack tissue
- i. Sprayed of disinfectant to 188 locations
- j. Distributed 1,157 bottles of disinfectant liquid
- k. Distributed 163 bottles of hand sanitizer
- l. Distributed 19,236 face mask
- m. 86 times training how to make disinfectant
- n. Distributed 132 Personal Protection Equipment for the medical team
- o. Distributed 114 aprons full disposable
- p. Distributed gloves 1,608 set
- q. Distributed 52 boots
- r. Radio talk show 4 times
- s. Webinar meeting with the youth group, CSO, and government conducted with themes:
 - View and Youth Roles during Covid19
 - The village policy on Covid19
 - Community-Based Child Protection during covid19
 - Writing skill for youth
- t. Accessing online study via cube notes by 221 children
- u. Support foodbank at 3 villages and 22 Kitchen Garden
- v. Support

During the period of May to June 2020, below is the summary of partners intervention during the pandemic:

- 4,941 children received support in house vegetable planting for food security program
- 504 youth received support to develop catfish in house farming
- 4,407 children and youth received integrated education program during covid19
- 796 children and parents received educational materials related to hand washing stations for the community in every home
- 1,537 adult took part in an interactive dialogue to optimize distance learning during covid19 pandemic
- 3,159 parents of toddlers and children age 6-14 attended parenting online classes.
- 75 community base child protection team in villages/ sub districts are actively involved in prevention and responses to covid19.
- 244 youth received full information related to covid19 prevention
- 100 people participated on healthy snack contest
- 8 mosque youth group produced face shield.

ChildFund Indonesia will remain to collaborate with existing partners as the Covid19 also affected community in all areas of ChildFund's partners. At the same time, the partners developing their Program Development Design (PDD) for the FY 21. The PDD on consultation with technical person at ChildFund to provide input or review.

3.b.1. Stop COVID-19 from infecting children and families

ChildFund's Global Response Plan

To help children and families protect themselves from COVID-19, we are installing community, handwashing stands; educating communities about symptoms, hygiene measures and where to get tested or treatment; and distributing soap, hand sanitizer, gloves and masks to families and frontline, health workers. For children who are being treated for COVID-19 or are subject to quarantine measures, we are creating child-friendly spaces with age-appropriate toys and reading matter.

The covid 19 project continue supporting by CF Korea. Hand over of 10 hand washing stations at 2 villages, distribution of face mask for 3,000 people and 2,000 IEC materials been conducted on 1 July 2020. Furthermore, the installation all 10 hand washing station located in targeted place.

3.b.2. Ensure that children get food they need

ChildFund's Global Response Plan

To ensure that the most vulnerable families can keep food on the table, pay rent and cover other basic needs, we are providing cash for those families most needing this support, such as those who have lost their income because of COVID-19, child or elder-headed households, and/or households affected by disability or chronic illness. Where possible, we are distributing food and basic household items directly, carefully abiding by COVID-19 protection measures

3.b.2. 1. Cash Transfers and vouchers

- ChildFund will implement cash assistance program funded by CF Korea for 2 partners working area and another 5 partners will do Cash assistance Program using existing subsidy and addition subsidy funds from International Office and Non-Sponsorship Program Funds.
- After the inception workshop, the project team conducted beneficiaries registration along with local government. At the same time, the project team assess the location where the hand

washing station to be install and currently the hand washing materials been assembly and hand over to the local authority to be install in agreed location.

- ChildFund Indonesia brief the case assistance program to 5 partners which will implement the case assistance program. Coordination and registration will conduct by partners along with local government. The financial service provider will using PT Post Indonesia where ChildFund Indonesia signed MoU at National Level. PT Pos Indonesia will disburse the cash assistance program funds to their office in targeted areas.

3.b.2.2. Other responses in relation to objective 3.b.2.

- When Partners identified family under the observation of Covid19, therefore food support provided to the family as they quarantine and not possible to do work and earn money. This happened to enroll the family under the observation of Covid19 at South Sumatera.

3.b.3. Keep children safe from Violence: physically and emotionally

ChildFund’s Global Response Plan
 We are supporting community-based child protection systems that identify, respond to and refer cases of abuse, neglect, violence or exploitation. We are also providing virtual, online psychological first aid and counseling, and supporting temporary shelters for children who live on the street, providing hygiene supplies, food and other basics. We are also arranging safe and appropriate care for children who are separated from their caregivers due to treatment or prevention measures.

ChildFund Indonesia along with IJF members (ChildFund, Save the Children, Plan, Wahana Visi, Plan, SOS and PKPA) facilitated child consultation on 6 July 2020 among Child Led Group with National Children Forum who formed under Ministry of Women Empowerment and Child Protection (KPPPA). On 09 July 2020, IJF will facilitate Child Consultation with Indonesia Commission of Child Protection (KPAI).

ChildFund Indonesia will organize 2nd online survey targeted children and parents who have a children. Several aspect will study and the tools being develop. The survey expected to begin 3rd week of July 2020.

3.b.4. Help children continue to do their job: Learning

ChildFund's Global Response Plan

While schools remain closed, we are supporting children's learning through activities and tutoring sessions online or by radio. For students without reliable internet access, we are distributing home learning kits with materials and guides for their use.

3.b.5. Other responses

ChildFund provided guidelines for parents on how to manage the situation during covid19 hence the children will do a happy home learning session.
