

Ending violence against children in the Pacific and Timor Leste



What is the 'value-add' of an Australian Coalition to End Violence against Children?

- A collective of child-focused agencies working across 'the Pacific' (15 countries – PNG, Vanuatu, Solomon Islands, Fiji, Kiribati, Samoa, Tonga, Timor Leste, Tuvalu, Nauru, Niue, Palau, Marshall Islands, Cook Islands)
- Same drivers of advocacy government budget to increase spending on EVAC, enhance commitment to data collection, utilize INSPIRE model, proactively include the voice of children.
- Develop a national advocacy and communications plan whereby ChildFund, PLAN, World Vision and Save The Children 'Australia" can approach Australian Government and Pacific Governments.



Key Messages

- NO systematic tracking mechanism to identify what spending is targeted at ending violence against children (EVAC)
- Level of violent disciple in the home is high across the region ranging between 70-87%
- Key Drivers of Violence in the Pacific and Timor Leste
- What is the Australian government's total expenditure on EVAC through its ODA (2014-2017)?
- What portion of Australian Government and other donor expenditure (top 10) is spent on EVAC programs in 14 Pacific countries and Timor Leste

- ChildFund PNG Justice for All EVAC program and its successful influence on child protection legislation
- PLAN International Timor Leste Equal Playing Fields for Schools Program – respectful relationships and sports model.
- Save The Children Solomon Islands Child Trafficking project
- World Vision Vanuatu Reducing GBV Channels of Hope

Key Asks

- Key Recommendations
- 1. Increased Funding: Commit at least 5 percent of ODA to EVAC specific initiatives
- 2. Measuring EVAC: development of an 'ending violence against children' policy marker by donor countries to enable the tracking and reporting of expenditure
- **3. Policy Platform:** put children at the centre of development by establishing a unit to oversee the mainstreaming of children's rights across all thematic areas of its development cooperation program and to account for and help to track DFAT's spend on children..
- **4. Adopt a child rights focus within existing gender programs and greater interconnectivity between programs:** between domestic violence, gender-based violence, gender equality and EVAC programs



Agreed Actions

National

- Co-brand Joint launch 3rd June (elections)
- Media liaison across agencies to leverage contacts and coordinate human case-studies for high-profile media release.
- CEO liaison across agencies to determine government advocacy approach

International/Global

- STC/WorldVision/ChildFund Secretariat liaison in NY to aim for side-event at HLPF with report.
- Bi-lateral 'Post' engagement with VNR governments and Australian representatives.
- Explore GPeV interest in report and research
