

Indonesia Country Office Situation Report 05 – Lombok Earthquake

DATE: 21 Sept 2018

Introduction

Country/Location: Lombok Island (Nusa Tenggara Barat Province, Indonesia)

Title of emergency: Earthquake 7RS

Dates covered by report: 28 August – 21 Sept 2018

Situation Report No: 5

Summary

A series of aftershocks have continued to occur in Lombok following the initial earthquake on 29th July and the larger more devastating one on August 5th 2018 with this being felt up 125 times right up to 19 Sept 2018. Official statistics report a total 564 people killed, 1,584 injured and 149,715 damages houses, 358,029 IDPs (*Command post report 19 Sept 2018*)

Following assessments of the damage Government reported that 14,390 houses have been identified for rebuilding. A total of 836 schools are damaged (378 severely damage, 200 medium damage, 258 light damage) primarily elementary schools. 61 schools are ready for rebuilding.

Central government through Disaster Management Agency (BNPB) continue support the Lombok Command Post for the response effort. Central government deployed 400 engineer to support assess the infrastructure and help local government to verify damage building.

General overview:

Lombok Island continue hit by earthquake after first aftershock 29 July 2018. It's reported 4 earthquake cause of casualties; 6.4RS occurred on July 29, 7RS occurred on August 5th, 6.2RS occurred on 9 August and 7RS occurred Sept 19th. In Mataram (Capital City of Lombok), students began to return to school on 26 August 2018 as instructed by the government. Teaching activities have started mainly in tents and under tarpaulins. To facilitate swifter access to better facilities and given that full reconstruction will take some time, the Government is building semi-permanent class rooms which will be used as transition building until new permanent buildings are complete. Trading activity has recommenced. Many traditional markets are functioning, grocery shops are open and supplies are available.

National Emergency Response:

The official state of Emergency ended on 25 August 2018 and transition toward recovery status commenced on 26 August 2018.

The president of Republic Indonesia handed over the subsidies to 5,293 verified house owners to build their houses. The total funds allocated was Rp 264,000,000,000 (equal to US\$ 18,333,333) transferred to recipients through the State Bank Account (Bank Rakyat Indonesia).

The President instructed the government ministries/institutions and head of districts of the affected areas to accelerate the rehabilitation and reconstruction in their areas.

Rehabilitation efforts comprise :

- a. Improvement of the environment,

- b. Repair of public infrastructure and facilities,
- c. Provision of support for repair of damaged houses of disaster-affected people,
- d. Socio-psychological recovery,
- e. Health services,
- f. Recovery of socio-economic and cultural aspects,
- g. Restore safety and order,
- h. Revitalization of government functions, and
- i. Revitalization of public services function.

The reconstruction effort will consist of:

- a. Re-building the infrastructure and facilities,
- b. Re-building of community social facilities,
- c. Revitalization of socio-culture of the community,
- d. Applying the right design and use of better equipment for disaster-resistant buildings,
- e. Participation and role of non-government organization and community-based organization, private sector and civil society,
- f. Restoring the socio-economic and cultural condition,
- g. Enhancement of public service function, and
- h. Enhancement of main services for the community.

The instruction stipulates that the rehabilitation and reconstruction of facilities for education, health, religious activities and support for economic activities must be completed by the end of December 2018 and other facilities will have to be finished in December 2019, at the latest.

Cluster meetings continue in Lombok Province every two weeks and some meeting organize if there is any issue need to hold a meeting. WASH, Education, Child Protection, Shelter cluster meeting are actively organize coordination meeting.

The earthquakes have left thousands of people homeless, and living in open fields. 128 people have been diagnosed with Malaria. This is an extraordinary occurrence of malaria, according to Head of West Lombok District. The central government deployed medical team to support local hospital where they operate on mobile hospital.

PRIORITY NEEDS:

1. Clean water and Installation of water tanks at camps
2. Daily stipend for IDPs
3. Trauma healing and psychosocial support for affected family
4. Heavy equipment to clean debris
5. Mobile toilet
6. Tents, matrass and blanket
7. Emergency school tents

Local coordination in Lombok

Incident Command Post(s) continue lead the transition response with strong support from Military. Provincial government established the command structure from emergency transition to recovery phase (KOGASGABPAD) Lead by Military to coordinate all response. In order to expedite and harmonize the transition, therefore provincial government establishes Provincial Secretariat with task:

1. To coordinate all provincial resources to support the KOGASGABPAD

2. To facilitate coordination amongst volunteer and aid
3. Regulation
4. Action Plan
5. Coordinate the planning and budgeting
6. To coordinate rehabilitation and reconstruction with central government, districts, private sector, university, NGO and other related partners that do support for Lombok
7. Circulate data and information
8. Monitoring and evaluation
9. Reporting

Other agencies

National and International NGO in coordination with local NGOs continue to support the need of affected people. Food and non-food items, education in emergency and psychosocial support activity to affected children and parents facilitated by NGO supported by volunteers and trained community.

Some NGO also providing support to build prototype of temporary shelter using tarps, used material from damage houses and providing support for temporary toilet and water faucet.

All transition to recovery effort should coordinate and using the cluster approach defines by Government of Indonesia.

Overview of ChildFund response (for INTERNAL use)

1. **ChildFund Indonesia is supporting GAGAS a local NGO based in Lombok** to respond through provision of psychosocial support and transition education program in one village Sambik Bankol. GAGAS are coordinating with village authorities, camp coordinators and school principals to support the need of affected community. GAGAS has established 3 Child Centered Spaces at Penjajak, Pepanda and LUK Sub Village at Sambik Bangkol Village. GAGAS's volunteers continue to register children who affected by disaster as many of them fled from the village after the earthquake and are just return to the village. Recreational activities continue to be conducted by Volunteers where temporary school activity organize by teacher and continue with recreational activity by the volunteer. GAGAS continue developing their plan to fit the need of psychosocial activities instead of recreational activity only. The volunteer embedded materials of Personal Hygiene promotion and Child protection issue to the children. At this moment, GAGAS could not provide exact number of children during CCS session but it roughly 300 girls and boys involve at CCS session. GAGAS found there is a need to set another 2 CCS sites in Sambik Bangkol Village as many family returns to their original land living at temporary house therefore scattered family make the children difficult to access 3 established CCS. GAGAS plan to train 30 communities as a volunteer to be able to facilitate CCS at camps.
2. **Mandate and Coordination with government:** In national coordination meetings, the Ministry Social Affairs have indicated that they need as much support as possible and they encourage support from NGOs based in Indonesia to support the assessment and response efforts in coordination with the government effort. Ministry of Social Affairs held a meeting with NGOs on 19 Sept 2018 at IOM Office to discuss psychosocial support to affected people and challenges found in field.
3. **Strategic alignment: a CPiE project** focus aligns with CF Indonesia and CFI global focus on Child protection in Emergencies and gives us some credibility as a humanitarian actor. ChildFund Indonesia at National Level continue engage at Protection and Displacement Sub Cluster coordination meeting where at the response project, Child Fund not only intervene Psychosocial

Support only but also initiate Community Base Child Protection mechanism at camps and in future the mechanism expected will apply at village level.

4. **Funding secured:** So far \$98,000 has been raised from ChildFund Alliance (US\$ 60K from ChildFund Korea, CF International US\$ 20K, CF Taiwan US\$ 10K and CF Australia Aus\$ 10K) A further \$60K has been has been offered by CFK and negotiations are underway to firm up the specific activities that this will cover for the following 3 months. This will enable a US\$ 160K response effort over 6 months.
5. **Project adjustments :** Following recent monitoring visits including a brief visit with ChildFund Korea to Lombok, it was noted that significant challenges exit in regard to WASH facilities and it was agreed that this needs to be addressed and taken into account as part of enabling effective CCS . ChildFund Indonesia is working with GAGAS to revise the proposal to respond to these needs and to utilize the additional 60K to support this focus.

For ChildFund staff:

- i. **Domestic travel:** There is no restriction and risk travel to NTT and Lombok as both Airport resume to normal. Travel advisory will be updated as required
- ii. **International travel:** All ChildFund staff or visitors requiring travel East can transit at Jakarta and Bali.

- **Security & logistics**

Security: it is still unclear whether, further earthquakes or shocks will take place, and CF therefore encourage staff to support Lombok Earthquake should equipped with Ready to go Bag (including tents and personal survivor). ChildFund been identified 4 hotel which safe to be used as accommodation when stay at Lombok (Hotel Viktor, Hotel Akila, Hotel Solas and Hotel Ratih), all hotel located at Mataram City.

Logistics: Goods supply to Lombok mostly imported from Java Island and the stock increasing to ready at Mataram City. Staffs who will travel to Lombok advise to bring limited stock of dry food and purchase at Mataram City as food stock including drinking water.

- Partnership and coordination: ChildFund begin partnership with Yayasan GAGAS for the emergency Response. Yayasan GAGAS has an office at Mataram City.
