

HONDURAS CO COVID 19 EMERGENCY PLAN RESPONSE SUMMARY / April 2020

Overall local objective

Contribute to the food security and comprehensive well-being of Children and their families during the emergency generated by COVID-19.

Budget

US\$205,929.07 (three-months emergency response)

Region Of The Americas' situation

The emergence of COVID-19 has brought unprecedented challenges in the Region of the Americas. Some of the problems that are common for the population that works with ChildFund are the following:

- Increased risk of contracting the virus due to poor hygiene practices and access to drinking water problems.
- Food insecurity of children, their families, and communities.
- Loss of livelihoods and increased vulnerabilities for children and their families.
- Increased risk of child abuse, violence against women and domestic violence.

Country Office Context

Restriction of mobility by government decree, curfew.

Program activities planning standoff: home officing and remote coordination with local partners responding in the emergency interacting with local government.

Coordination with the government through the Humanitarian Network.

• The Humanitarian Network in the Country and the cluster system have been activated, especially Cash Working Group and the Protection Group.

Expected Results

- 1. Improve the livelihood capacity of vulnerable families during the emergency.
- 2. Improve the application of prevention, protection, and emotional care measures during the emergency.

Communication Plan Objective

- 1. Contribute to the safety of families in the communities where ChildFund works with critical messages for well-being.
- 2. Contribute to the protection and prevention of violence against children + WASH prevention.
- 3. Brand positioning

Fundraising

- 1. Secure additional funds, raised from various identified sources to support 60% of families enrolled in Child Fund Honduras.
- 2. Before June 2020 = Provide heads of households with cash transfers (food vouchers or Cash).
- 3. Fundraising of US\$305,268 in three months.
- 4. Cash transfer of US\$40 to heads of households for COVID19 plus a preparedness/prevention kit.

Transparency, Monitoring and Evaluation

Monthly, with each local partner both in programs execution and budget execution
